Using Your Imagination

What has happened that needs help?

It could be a mountain rescue, a wildlife rescue, a beach rescue, a fire rescue or a medical rescue.

Use your imagination and write an interesting story about what happened.

- Draw a mind map.
- Research your storyline.
- Plan the structure of your story; beginning, build up, problem, resolution.
- plan to use expanded noun phrases, relative clauses etc.

Other classroom activities:

- Oral retelling of the Fender story.
- Written retelling of the story.
- Deconstruct the story.
- Talk about the main characters.
- Identification of language used eg nouns, adjectives, verbs, adverbs, conjunctions.



Role play of the Fender story – with the children reading different characters parts.

Write a song or poem about Fender and his friends.

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Write your own seal story



At the Seal Sanctuary, Dan and Annie carefully cut the fishing net off the little grey seal and put her in the nursery pool. A few weeks later, when she was well again, they set her free in the sea.

Write a short story of her first days back in the sea.

- How does she feel?
- What does she see?
- What does she find to eat?
- What happens?

She might meet dolphins, seahorses, octopus, a sunk ship etc





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
